

The Bash will set off from Bass Hill for the initial 10 day adventure, travelling through FOUR states and two new overnight locations, Port Pirie and Bunbury, together with visiting rural towns and schools along the way. You will travel on parts of the original, Nullarbor (dirt) Track and all this in celebration of a years' worth of fundraising for Variety – the Children's Charity and Australia's special needs children.

The second, and optional Bash, leaves Bunbury on its path-finding, six day adventure taking in the roughness, beauty and the colours of the Pilbara – the Outback at its most spectacular! Wait until you see the Iron Ore shipments being moved around this western state. Plus the beautiful colours of the Indian Ocean as we track north to Broome, Cape Leveque and Beagle Bay before visiting the Bardi Jawi people at One Arm Point, our northern most point of this Bash, for a seafood lunch.




The annual Variety Bash is Australia's most successful charity motoring event and is the focal point of the fund raising efforts by many hundreds of supporters of Variety. In fact, it's a Celebration of a year's hard work to raise the money so as to take part in this mighty event. Since 1985 over \$208 million has been raised by Variety Bashers.

How much will it cost?

It costs \$8,500 (minimum) to enter the Bash. This money is a donation and therefore is tax deductible. Any amount raised above this may be used for the purpose of bribing and corrupting the officials during the event. Check the Bash web site for Fundraising Trophies that are available for extra funds raised.

The Bash is run by devious officials proficient in prising money from Bashers. Blatant cheating and bribery are not only allowed but encouraged. Bashers can even be fined for taking the event too seriously, the amount depending on the seriousness of the seriousness!

The majority of meals are provided during the Bash and are covered, amongst other items, in a "provisions fee" which will need to be paid prior to the start. Other costs to consider include fuel, accommodation and transport home at the conclusion of the Bash.



Support vehicles

No individual support vehicles are allowed, however, space can be hired to carry spare parts on the official baggage truck which travels the entire Bash route. For those would-be Bashers who can't tell a dipstick from their big ends - don't worry. Travelling with the Bash are mobile workshops crewed by people whose job is to look after ALL Bash vehicles. Cars that look as though they are beyond repair have been transformed by the mobile workshops into miracles of motion and have been shepherded into the next town.



What is a Bash car?

You will need a reliable, well-built vehicle, manufactured during or pre 1976 with run on models restricted to four (4) additional years, which will survive Australia's notorious dirt roads. A Bash car and its crew needs to be noticed so that your sponsors receive some benefit. No amount of decoration is too much as long as it's within the RTA's laws.

The transmission, engine and engine ancillaries must be as originally specified for the vehicle. Fuel is always available, but it is advised to carry a jerry can as sometimes it is a long way between stops. Modifications to the body shape are permitted where such modifications are designed to enhance the appearance of the vehicle for sponsorship purposes or for fun! Modifications to the brakes, suspension and fuel tanks are allowed for safety but no improvements for extra speed or performance modifications.



Attention-grabbing and unusual decorations, for car and crew, make for a great Bash car - the stranger the better.

Two-wheel drive only.
No charabancs, omnibuses, motorbikes
or motorised wheelbarrows!



CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. All vehicles entered in the Bash must have been manufactured prior to or during 1976 with run on models restricted to four (4) additional years. They must be roadworthy, registered and insured as prescribed by State laws. 2. All vehicles must be conventional two wheel drive vehicles with a maximum crew of four people. Crew members must be a minimum of 18 years of age and hold a current Australian driver's licence. 3. Motorcycles, buses, coaches, caravans, skateboards or wheelbarrows are not allowed. 4. All vehicles must carry on the front doors the Bash door panels onto which must be fixed the allocated Bash number for that vehicle. All vehicles must place on their front windcreens the event sun strip decal featuring Variety and event sponsor's logos. The vehicle number must also be clearly visible, using white numbers on the front (100mm) and fluoro numbers on rear windows (150mm). All cars must also display the event sponsor's decals, as supplied by the organisers. 5. All vehicles are required to attend the nominated ChequePoint day prior to the start of the Bash. Any vehicles unable to attend the ChequePoint day need to obtain prior consent from the Motoring Events Manager. 6. Everyone taking part in the Bash in any way must sign an indemnity form issued by Variety – the Children's Charity (NSW). 7. All entrants in the Bash must have paid to Variety – the Children's Charity (NSW) either personally or through donations the sum on the Entry Form by the specified dates and prior to the start of the event. 8. Any meal money, palaeon bookings or extra merchandise MUST be paid prior to the start of the event. 9. At all times all entrants must abide by the rules of the road as prescribed by State laws and statutes.
